## Basketball Tournaments are cancelled

## Appointments and Planned Absences – State Testing

Setting the state testing schedule at the middle school requires focusing a number of resources on the four weeks of testing. We coordinate teachers, paras, and volunteers, with computer labs and available classrooms to create a unique schedule to accommodate the needs of all students.

Since the state requires that all students must be tested in math and reading, as well as 7<sup>th</sup> grade students in Science, we request that when scheduling appointments or any absence for your child, that you do so outside the established testing schedule.

Seventh and eighth grade students will be tested on April 5, 6, & 7 (Math and Reading) and on May 5 & 6 for 7<sup>th</sup> grade Science. Please do not schedule absences on these dates.

Fifth and sixth grade students will be tested on March 24, 25, 26 and in the following week of March 30, 31 and April 1. Please do not schedule absences on these dates. Thank you for your help.

## PTO & Site Council on January 21<sup>st</sup> and 20th

## Early Arrival

The student handbook says that the front doors at PLMS open at 7:45. However, during cold and inclement weather, students will be able to access the building before 7:30.

## Early School Dismissal

If inclement weather strikes, Dr. Yoder, the Superintendent of Schools, will make the decision after due consideration of all factors to send students home early.

- School Reach (automated phone messaging service) will be initiated to call all designated parent-guardian phone numbers.
- Media will be notified: WDAF TV - Kansas City, TV Channel 4, WIBW - Topeka, TV Channel 13, radio 580 AM and 94.5 FM.
- Parents of students at either building may send special instructions to the office for early dismissal. We will keep those instructions on file. It is important that we reduce incoming and outgoing phone calls to those to only those that deal with getting our students safely to the proper destination.

- On bus routes, drivers determine that a student can get into their house before they leave each drop point.
- An administrator will remain at the school phone until all buses have delivered students home.

Guaranteeing every student's safety is our priority.

To accommodate the number of boys on the eighth grade basketball team, Coach Hoffman has scheduled 2 extra intra-squad games on February 12th, and 19th.



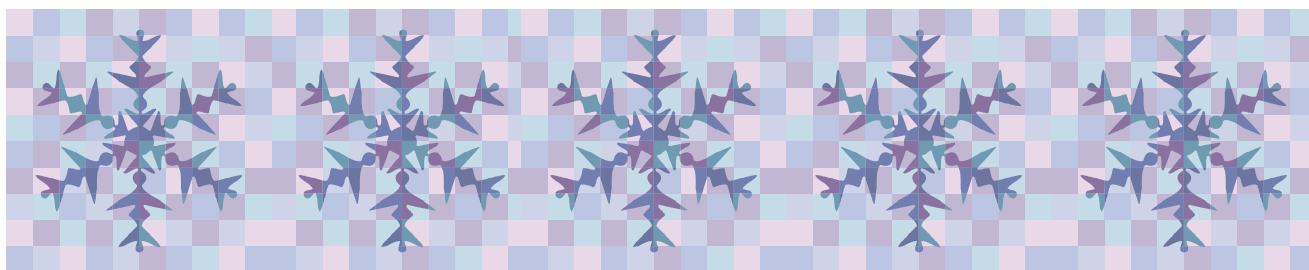
## Boys BB Game Rescheduled

Dear Parents:

Our schools will soon be administering to students an annual statewide needs assessment, called the *Kansas Communities That Care Student Survey*. Survey results will be used to help plan substance abuse prevention programs in our district. This survey, which is funded by Addiction and Prevention Services of the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, is for students in the 6th, 8th, 10th and 12th grades.

I believe this survey is a good tool for teachers and parents to understand the extent of drug and alcohol awareness by our kids, as well as the extent of substance use. More importantly, I believe it is a worthwhile undertaking that will help create more effective programming by our school and various community organizations to combat problems associated with alcohol and drug use.

***The survey includes questions on alcohol, drugs, tobacco, and family and community factors related to substance use. You may also be interested to know the following:***

- 1. It is completely anonymous.** Students will not be asked for their names on the questionnaire, nor will anyone be able to connect any individual student with his/her responses. School staff will not see any one student's responses, but only summaries of results. To further guarantee anonymity, results will not be reported on any particular question without sufficient response from enough students.
- 2. Participation is entirely voluntary.** Your child may simply skip any particular question they do not wish to answer.

I hope you will allow your child to participate in this statewide effort. If you agree, you need do nothing further. However, if for any reason you do not wish your child to participate, please contact the school counselor, and your child will be excused from participation. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
